Dear homeowner or occupier,

We will shortly be commencing works on the Shalford Traffic Calming scheme from 31st March to 17th April, along the A248 Kings Road. This consists of reducing the speed limit to 20 Mph, installing 2 Road Tables, 2 sets of Road Cushions, new traffic signs and new road markings.

There will be a 24 hour full road closure whilst these works are constructed between 31st March to 17th April 2025.

Following some feedback on working arrangements on Kings Road, the divisional councillor Matt Furniss has requested this supplementary letter to be prepared to help clarify this.

During the first phase (road table on the zebra crossing) of the closure Kings Road will be closed (approximately 1 ½ weeks) from the roundabout with A281 Horsham Road to about 20metres east of Station Road. Therefore access/exit from Station Road and Chinthurst Lane won't be available at this point. To access Kings Road to the east, motorists will need to follow the signed diversion clockwise via Wonersh and Bramley along A248 Christmas Hill, B2128 Wonersh Common, The Street, Station Road, A281 Horsham Road and back to Kings Road (and anti clockwise in the opposite direction). Access to Station Road (Shalford) will be available from its eastern end with Kings Rd/Christmas Hill, and via the diversion listed previously. Access to Kings Road close to the roundabout will still be available via the short one-way section. Access to the Village Hall will be maintained from the east.

During phase 2 (road table at the traffic island) Kings Road will be closed (approximately 1 week) between the entrance to Shalford Village Hall to its junction with the eastern end of Station Road. Access to Kings Road will be available from each end or via the signed diversion route described above via Wonersh and Bramley. Access to Station Road will be available at both ends, although 'unsuitable diversion route' signs will be erected at each end of Station Road to deter through traffic motorists from using this route to bypass the closure. Access to the Village Hall will be maintained from the west.

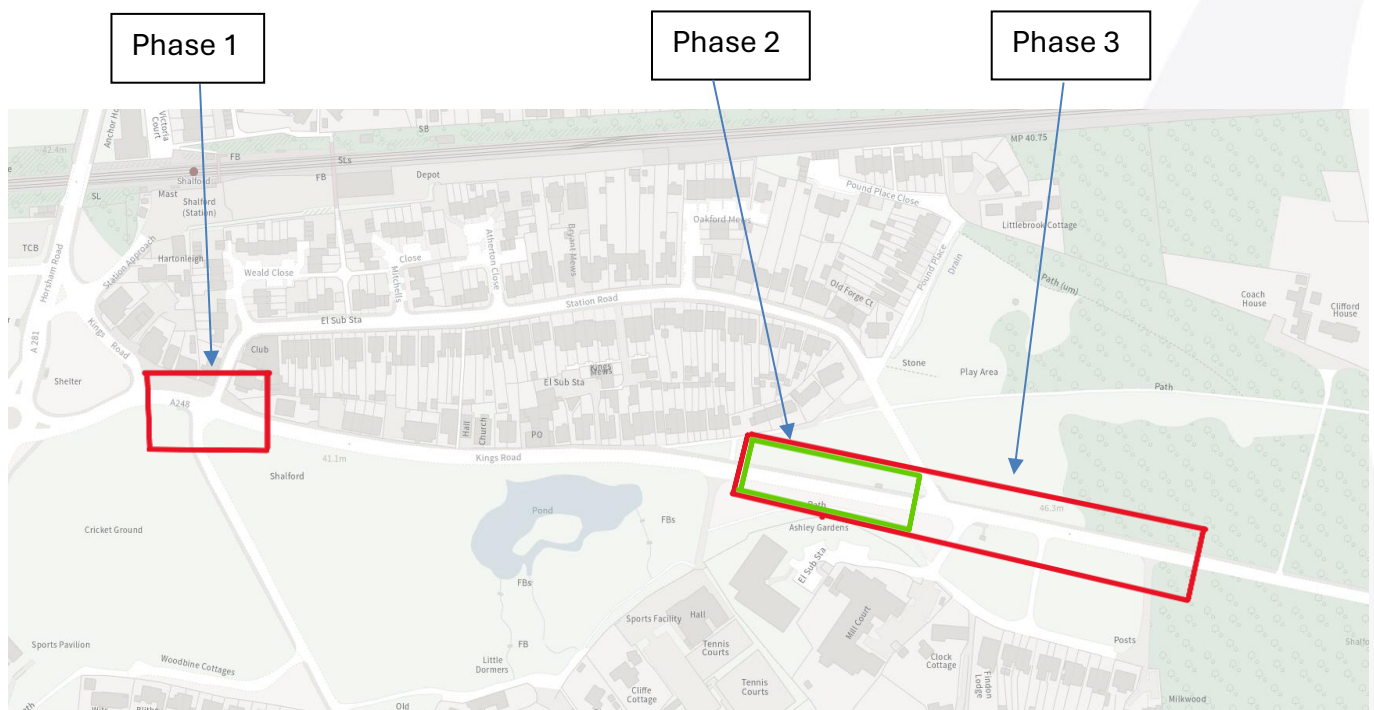

For the final phase 3 (speed cushions) Kings Road will be closed the same as phase 2, but during the day time only the closure will be extended eastwards 200m east of its junction with the eastern end of Station Road. Access to Kings Road and the Village Hall will be available from A281 Horsham Road roundabout or via the signed diversion. Access for residents of Christmas Hill will be available from the east or via the diversion route. Access to Station Road will be available at its western end with Kings Road.

Throughout the closures above, Road Closed signs will still be erected at the A281 Horsham Road roundabout and the Kings Road/New Road junction and diversion signs to suit to ensure through traffic follows the correct route via Wonersh and Bramley. 'Businesses open as usual' and 'access only' signs will also be erected. Unsuitable Diversion Route signs will also be in place at some of the other side roads.

A phased plan is shown below to help clarify the 3 phases:



We will make sure you can get to and from your house or business when it is safe to do so, however delays may sometimes occur. Please talk to a member of our staff on site if you need help – talking to our staff can solve most issues.
